Pastor's Message

I remember my time at seminary and guys dreading a "blue couch" meeting. Our Rector had a sitting area in his office with an upright chair and a blue couch. The rector would sit in his chair, and the seminarian would be seated on the blue couch. As seminarians, there was a measure of humour and ribbing one another about potential blue couch meetings, because often these meetings tended to centre on correction: some area of our life that needed improvement, or something that we needed to change in our behaviour or comportment. Though these meetings were never easy, looking back, they were necessary to help us to improve and to grow. This was a formation program after all. At the very base level, they were also an indication that our Rector took his job seriously and wanted to do his best to help us to be the best men that we could be so that God-willing we would be even better priests. Often these moments of correction were appreciated in hindsight, with a clearer vision to the charity underlining them.

In the Gospel reading, the Lord gives clear instruction about how fraternal correction is to be carried out. What a benefit for us to have the Lord's words on this matter, guiding our attempts to address real issues that come up in the life of the Church, and in our relationships with one another. Coupled with the first reading from the prophet Ezekiel, we are reminded of the responsibility that we have in charity to address these issues that come forward. Grounding fraternal correction in charity provides the impetus to follow through. Our willingness to engage in fraternal correction may in fact help the person to become aware of a behaviour or issue they didn't realize was creating problems for others. At the same time, keeping charity in mind when on the receiving end of correction, is also helpful. The fact that this person is coming forward with their concern or correction, is an immediate expression that they care, regardless of how difficult these moments are. Charity in the giving, and charity in the receiving. If we can keep this rule in the forefront, as we follow the steps outlined by our Lord, then the necessary work of becoming better people, becoming holier people will more effectively take place.
